Don D. Coffman, Professor of Music Education, chairs the Department of Music Education and Music Therapy at the University of Miami's Frost School of Music and is Professor Emeritus at the University of Iowa, where he taught for 24 years. He founded the Iowa City, Iowa New Horizons Band in 1995 and led it for 16 years. He currently leads the New Horizons Band program at the Frost School of Music.

Don and Stacy celebrated 39 years of marriage in May 2020. Stacy is Director of Infection Prevention at Nicklaus Children's Hospital. Their son Nicolas completed his PhD in Music Education from the University of Miami in May 2020. He is married to Johanna Abril (also an alum) who is the first PhD in Music Education in her country of Ecuador. They are teaching in Quito and are devoted to two lovable dogs, Chichi and Coco.



Roy Ernst is the founder of the New Horizons Band and New Horizons Music. He began his career in Michigan, where he taught instrumental music in elementary and secondary schools. He received his BS and MS degrees from Wayne State University and a Ph.D. from The University of Michigan. Roy is a professor emeritus of the Eastman School of Music of the University of Rochester, where he taught for 25 years.

In 1991, he started the first New Horizons Band at Eastman for the purpose of creating a model program emphasizing entry and reentry points to music making for senior adults. Roy continues his work to support New Horizons programs as the advisor to the Board of Directors of the New Horizons International Music Association. There are now more than 200 New Horizons organizations.



Dr. Nolan Hauta is Director of Jazz and Athletic Bands and Assistant Professor of Music at the University of Dubuque. There he teaches Jazz Band, Pep Band, Low Brass Lessons, and Guitar Lessons. Hauta earned a Doctor of Musical Arts Degree in Wind Conducting from the University of Iowa where he conducted the three concert bands, chamber winds, pep band, and the 250-member Hawkeye Marching Band. For three years he also assisted with the Iowa Honor Band, Iowa Summer Music Camps, and the Iowa City New Horizons Band. Hauta completed a Bachelor of Arts degree in Music with high distinction from the University of Minnesota, Morris and a Master of Music degree in Music Education from the University of Minnesota, Duluth. Hauta taught in the Eden Prairie, Ely, and Roseau school districts of Minnesota. He has conducted ensembles of all ages: elementary, middle school, high school, college,

and adult. He is active as a clinician, trombonist, and guest conductor. Hauta lives in Dubuque, Iowa with his wife, two sons, and two cats.
